Project: Climate Corps Fellows & EV Training

The Center of Excellence for Clean Energy is partnering with the WA Department of Commerce, who has won a \$7.7 million Department of Energy grant, to place 60 Climate Corps Fellows throughout the community and technical college system to work on meeting the state's Clean Buildings Act. These fellows will benchmark energy consumption and recommended retrofits for Tier 1 buildings owned by colleges, school districts, and non-profits.

The Center is also partnering with WSU Green Transportation to offer in-person EV training for community and technical college faculty on a quarterly basis – training dates will be released soon.

Workforce Deans Academy – We're excited to share that this year's Workforce Deans Academy received a record number of applications. The Academy Board selected a full cohort of 17 individuals, with broad representation from colleges across the state. We're excited to kick off the Academy in October and support this diverse group of workforce education leaders.

Boot Camps for Professional/Technical Faculty – After successfully transitioning the Boot Camps from Olympic to Green River College, we hosted our first Basic Boot Camp in early September. It was fully booked with 20 participants from across the system, and we already have a waitlist of 8 more. We're working closely with our Boot Camp instructors to schedule another camp this fall to meet demand. Additionally, we're planning a full curriculum review and update for the winter quarter.

Project: Short-Term Manufacturing Training Framework

In close partnership with industry, the Semiconductor & Electronics Manufacturing Center of Excellence is developing a short-term training template to prepare marginalized individuals in the 17-29 age group to work in targeted entry-level Advanced Manufacturing or High-Tech Manufacturing roles after completing 40 hours of classroom and lab-based training. The Center expects to launch an initial pilot at a college in January 2025 and will then prepare the framework for broader adoption. Underrepresented students participating in the pilot will receive a stipend from WorkSource.
